Every eligible applicant who participates in the event is guaranteed the minimum PACE scholarship. You must apply for admission by February 3, 2012 in order to be considered. Servant Leaders' Scholarship (Full Tuition)

Requirements: Minimum 3.75 GPA (non-weighted) **AND** ACT 25 composite score **OR** SAT 1130 combined math/verbal score. Available to first-time freshman students **ONLY**. Renewal: 3.5 cumulative GPA

This scholarship requires the student to work on campus for approx. 10 hours a week in various departments and roles. This past year it was awarded to 10 students, but that can vary depending on the applicant pool. The student must go through an interview process beginning in January and will generally know the outcome by the end of February. If they are NOT chosen for the scholarship, they automatically qualify for the Pierson's \$10,000 scholarship which is renewable and has no limit to the number of students that it is award to.

Pierson Missionary Leaders' Scholarship (\$10,000)

Requirements: Minimum 3.75 GPA (non-weighted) and/or top 15% of graduating class, and/or ACT 25 composite score or SAT 1130 combined math/verbal score

*must meet at least two of the above requirements. Home school students must meet GPA and ACT/SAT requirements. Renewal: 3.5 cumulative GPA

Students should apply by Christmas break in order to get through the acceptance process by the time interviews are scheduled.

10th & 11th Grade Students: Prepare for the SAT® Essay

The 2011–12 edition of *ScoreWrite: A Guide to Preparing for the SAT Essay* is now available online at www.collegeboard.org/scorewrite. *ScoreWrite* complements the PSAT/NMSQT writing skills section by providing everything your school needs to administer and score a practice SAT essay. Now is the best time to plan a practice essay session.

Applications for the **2012 UC Berkeley** school year will be available soon, so here are some key points to share with your students to position themselves as potential Cal prospects:

- Students must complete 15 core classes to be eligible for admission. At least seven of them must be taken in their last two years of high school, and eleven need to be taken prior to senior year. They include 4 years of English, 3 years of Mathematics, 2 years of Foreign Language, History, and Laboratory Science, and 1 year of College-Prep Electives and Visual/Performing Arts.
- UC Berkeley accepts test scores from both the ACT and SAT. All testing must be completed by December of the year prior to the desired semester of admission (for example, when applying for fall 2012, tests must be completed by December 2011).
- A diversity of experiences and perspectives is highly valued at UC Berkeley. Likewise, more out-of-state students are being enrolled than ever. According to a 2010 report from the university, there was a 20% combined increase of out-of-state and international students, with projections of even larger out-of-state student admissions for the upcoming school year.

Juniors & Seniors:

Plan your community college course load using the Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC). Completing these courses ensures you're on the right track to transfer to a university quickly and easily. **aztransfer.com is a very valuable site.**

Credit by exam: AP, CLEP, IB and other exams can earn you college credit. Check the "Exam Equivalency Guide" on aztransfer.com to see how your scores transfer to college credit at Arizona's community colleges and universities.

If you have taken, or are taking **community college courses**, use the aztransfer.com to use the Course Equivalency Guide to learn how you credits transfer to ASU, NAU, and U of A.
